



Lower Satsop River Floodplain Restoration Project



Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW) was funded by the Chehalis Flood Control Authority to restore natural fluvial processes and floodplain connectivity along the lower Satsop River to

- reduce bank erosion,
- protect agricultural soils, and
- improve fish and wildlife habitat

WDFW invited the local community and stakeholders to a kickoff meeting in March 2014. After hearing from stakeholders, WDFW developed preliminary project alternatives to meet the goals and objectives of the project and completed modeling of the river hydraulics for project elements. We would like to share what we've learned with the local community and stakeholders to further evaluate the benefits and impacts of the project alternatives. This will help to inform the selection of a preferred project alternative which will be developed to a 60% design level.

Please join WDFW and the project team to learn more about this project and your role in its success. We will review the history of the project and project alternatives. Your knowledge of the river and surrounding infrastructure is a key to a successful project.
