The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) is asking for public input under the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) on the proposed North Shore Levee project in the cities of Hoquiam and Aberdeen. The purpose of the project is to reduce flood damage in both cities. Funding for this project would be provided through the [Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities \(BRIC\)](#) and [Pre- Disaster Mitigation \(PDM\)](#) Programs.
