Notes: 1. Maximum shareling height may be increased to 45 feet with approval of a view corridor analysis conducted according to SMB Section F 03 03/F).					

Maximum height in C-1 zone and I zone is 45 feet (MMC 17.28.060(1) and 17.32.060(1)). Height greater than 45 feet is allowed in the I zone with a CUP (MMC 17.32.060(1)).

- 3. Agriculture
 - Applies only to new agricultural activities, does not limit or modify existing uses
- 4. Aquaculture
