Peer Consultations

- Monitoring charge and performance bonding
- Drone photography? (FAA) Limits of aerial photos.
- Limits on development of bulkheads or dock – lots of permitting people are not prepared for within water structures – need for permit applicant education
- FEMA does community assistance visits/audits – could be useful feedback loop because it has relevance to other codes
- Education for planners (one stop shop with data, guidance manuals, etc.)
- Single family manuals – Mason and Kitsap Counties have manuals – Commerce will post on Handbook web site
- Sequim identified all wetlands with its CAO update. So did Mount Vernon, Aberdeen, and Ocean Shores. The data is only good for so long, but it provides a legitimate baseline.
- Bellingham and Snohomish County have also mapped wetlands delineated in project applications.
