Web Traffic Report

Margeret Musser, Office for Regulatory Innovation and Assistance

- Presented the web traffic report³ for Quarter 4 of 2015 (Oct 1 Dec 31):
 - Small Business HTML;
 - Small Business Guide PDF downloads; and
 - o Calendar of Events
- The time customers spent visiting each site is not captured as the information is unreliable.
- A quarterly web traffic report will be presented to the Small Business Liaison Team each month; next month's report will include data from Nov 1, 2015 to Jan 31, 2016.

Liquor and Cannabis Board – Agency Updates

Edmon Lee, Liquor and Cannabis Board

- Last year agency name changed from Liquor Control Board to the current Liquor and Cannabis Board (LCB) as part of SB 5052.
- SB 5052 Creates one singular system (both medical and recreational marijuana); LCB recently increased the retail licenses cap from 334 to 556
- Current counts of Marijuana licenses issued: 232 Retail; 145 Producer; 593
 Producer/Processor; and 87 Processor (only); over 1,000 licenses issued overall (mostly
 small businesses). Visit: <u>LCB Weekly Marijuana Report</u>⁴ for continuous updates.
- Liquor licensing is growing at 5% a year with around over 16,500 current liquor licensees throughout the state.
- Liquor license processing time target has been reduced from 90 days to 60 days:
 - Lean Activities actively searched for ways to speed up the licensing process
 - Switched from mail to electronic notices to local authorities (reduced time by 4-6 days)
 - Switched from 100+ page Power Point presentation to a 15 minute training video for new licensed businesses.
 - Standard Cost Model (SCM) focusing on initial process of applying for liquor licenses to identify areas to improve – identified number of license types (200+) as a possible area to improve
- There are currently 50-60 pieces of legislation on marijuana and liquor, James Paribello who was unable to attend identified 3 of interest:

- HB2364 Affects out of state investors and LLC (Marijuana)
- HB2584 Adds exemptions to the Public Disclosure of businesses (Marijuana)
- HB2522 / HB2562 Adds sanctions to minors in possession (Marijuana currently penalties fall to the retail store)
- LCB participates in Results WA Goal 4 and Goal 5: Key Changes –Goal 5 metrics are being communicated with all state agencies
- They recently updated their strategic plan one of the major priorities is agency's data system which will be focusing on for the next two years to replace the legacy database system
- They recently finished and posted their <u>FY 2015 Annual Report</u>⁵. Also a <u>Marijuana Know</u> <u>the Facts</u>⁶ risk card was distributed to the SBLT members.

2015 SBLT Annual Report

Margeret Musser, Office for Regulatory Innovation and Assistance

- Based on the feedback received from the Small Business Liaison Team (SBLT), we developed the 2015 SBLT Annual Report. Please send comments/suggestions for improvement to <u>help@oria.wa.gov</u>.
 - Section 1 Executive Summary
 - Currently the charter lists HB 1818 (RCW 43.330.440); in reading through the RCW, it appears to relate specifically to streamlining projects involving ORIA and Commerce *not* necessarily SBLT. Should it therefore be removed?
 - History: in 2010 SBLT was focused on public outreach and the life cycle of businesses, it transitioned over the years to focus more on policy in part because of HB 1818
 - Recommendation: Keep in annual report/charter, but update verbiage to be less specific to types of streamlining projects (i.e. remove manufacturing industry) to keep with the spirit of the law
 - Recommendation: Instead of including the Executive Orders / RCW establishing the SBLT, maybe include examples of what SBLT has accomplished over the years since it was established
 - Recommendation: Update verbiage in the 2015 SBLT Accomplishments Small Business Guide section, specifically: "The SBG was accessed from the ORIA website approximately 170,000 times in 2015..."
 - Section 2 Background
 - **Recommendation:** Review mission statement to determine if still applicable

- Recommendation: Remove specific references to the Executive Orders and RCW in the numbered list and update verbiage of number 7 to be less specific to types of streamlining projects
- Recommendation: Add/list previous accomplishments by the SBLT over the years since it was established
- For the next couple of weeks, ORIA will maintain contact with SBLT members to finalize and post the 2015 Annual Report.

2016 Planning – What's next for SBLT in 2016

Scott Hitchcock, Office for Regulatory Innovation and Assistance

- Presented <u>power point presentation</u>⁷ listing current ideas with a focus on updating and increasing the outreach of the Small Business Guide (SBG) and continuing state agency and small business advisor presentations.
 - Subject Matter Expert (SME): instead of having agencies review the entire SBG each time, recommend they have a subject matter expert focus on the section(s) which apply to their agencies
 - Good Idea; however, there is a concern regarding staff availability
- SBLT members had a few suggestions:
 - More outreach/assistance with small construction companies
 - Choose metrics to track to determine how the SBLT can more effectively outreach to small businesses where SBLT should focus its attention
 - Add number of customers served throughout the year by SBLT members and/or outreach events to SBLT Annual report
- Discussion to be continued during the February meeting
