Update on Strategies to Increase State Utilization of Minority, Women and Veteran Owned Businesses

Theresa Berntsen, Office of Minority and Women's Business Enterprises

- Presented PowerPoint and passed out handouts:
 - o OMWBE Presentation to small business liaison teame
 - o Multi agency fact sheetf
 - SBA Reporter articleg Minority businesses are the fastest growing businesses
- By state law, OMWBE is required to measure and record the number of dollars spent on certified minority businesses by state agencies and educational institutions and provide the percentages to the governor. Goal is to Increase percentage of utilization by:
 - 10% for minority owned businesses

- 6% woman owned businesses
- 5% veteran owned businesses
- OMWBE Certifies:
 - Business is small by the Small Business Administration (SBA) standards which use
 NAICS codes (\$23.98 million and less a year constitutes a small business)
 - Business is owned and controlled by a person that is socially and economically disadvantaged:
 - Women and minorities are considered socially disadvantaged
 - You are considered economically disadvantaged if you are worth less than \$1.32 million (assets liquidation advantaged)
- Department of Veteran Affairs (DVA) certifies:
 - Business is owned by a veteran or service member
 - Business owners can be certified by both OMWBE and DVA if they meet the requirements for both
- How is Washington doing in regards to reaching our goals?
 - Current combined state (state agency and educational intuitions):
 - 1.65% minority owned certified businesses
 - 1.23% women owned certified businesses
 - 0.26% veteran owned certified businesses
 - o If we met our goals then minority, women and veteran owned small businesses would have received \$707.4 million in 2016
- Why isn't Washington meeting its goals?
 - Businesses aren't seeing the benefits to become certified:
 - 500k plus businesses in Washington
 - 90k businesses are minority or women owned businesses
 - 2500 businesses are certified by OMWBE
 - o Doing business with the government is very complicated
 - Certification takes too long: 45 days for state and 90 days for federal
 - Restrictions of I-200 (RCW 49.60.400); agencies cannot establish a quota and it's not mandatory
 - There are not enough certified businesses and agencies do not have the right tools, which is a catch 22.
- What is OMWBE doing to help Washington meet the established goals?
 - Business Diversity Subcabinet

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- Formed July 2015
- Tasked to develop a strategy to increase small and diverse business participation in Washington state contracting and procurement
- Made up of 13 state agencies (one legal)
- o Five areas of focus:
 - Disparity Study
 - hire consultant to gather and analyze data on 33 state agencies and educational institutions
 - Measurement Framework
 - > increase number of metrics to measure improvements and
 - increase use and reliability of data
 - Improved OMWBE Framework
 - eliminate regulatory barriers (regulatory reform);
 - > improve timelines and
 - innovate application process (online application available Oct 2017)
 - Community of Practice
 - provide tools, guides and best practices for agencies
 - > normalize the priority
 - Technical Assistance
 - customize information, assistance and outreach
 - provide consultation to businesses; and
 - create feedback loop for improvement

- Has there been any thought to working with city or counties that have their own certifications for small businesses?

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- Unfortunately it would be very difficult to do this because the state and the local jurisdictions have different criteria and goals
- There is new law on paid time off that will need to be added to the Small Business Guide;
 we need to make sure that the translations are up to date as well.
 - Action: Perhaps other SBLT agencies would help split the cost we need to start the conversation now
