#### Introduction

Quadco Regional Transportation Planning Organization's (QUADCO RTPO) Regional Transportation Improvement Plan (RTIP) is a compilation of regionally significant transportation projects planned for a sixyear period of 2025 through 2030. The QUADCO RTPO RTIP is comprised of member agency and State regional projects that prove to be regionally significant or have Federal funding mechanisms. For each project listed in the RTIP, a project title and summary, project cost, schedule, and funding sources are described. The RTIP is consistent with the QUADCO's Regional Transportation Plan 2017-2037 (https://www.ezview.wa.gov/Portals/\_1898/Documents/QUADCO-Plans/2017%20QUADCO%20Regional%20Transportation%20Plan\_Adopted%2012-8-2016.pdf) and WSDOT's Transportation Improvement Plan guidance for RTPOs.

Quadco RTPO is made up of four counties including Adams, Grant, Kittitas, and Lincoln Counties. Member agencies include counties, cities, tribal nations, ports and transit agencies. Additional coordination, planning, and implantation partnership efforts include federal, state, special districts, private sectors, the general public, and interest groups. Member agencies submit their TIPs (Appendix A) to QUADCO RTPO for inclusion in the RTIP. Only projects that meet QUADCO's definition of regional significance or have secured federal fund are included in the RTIP. Port agencies may submit their TIPs and/or project descriptions (Appendix B) to QUADCO RTPO for inclusion in the RTIP.

#### Development of the RTIP

QUADCO's RTIP was created with guidance from WSDOT's RTPO Transportation Improvement Plan (TIP) Review Checklist, as well as technical support. The RTIP is also required by RCW 47.80.023. RCW 47.80.023 states RTPOs shall develop, in cooperation with the department of transportation, operators of public transportation services and local governments within the region, a six-year regional transportation improvement program which proposes regionally significant transportation projects and programs and transportation demand management measures. The regional transportation improvement program shall be based on the programs, projects, and transportation demand management measures of regional significance as identified by transit agencies, cities, and counties pursuant to RCW 35.58.2795, 35.77.010, and 36.81.121, respectively, and any recommended programs or projects identified by the agency council on coordinated transportation, as provided in chapter 47.06B RCW, that advance special needs coordinated transportation as defined in RCW 47.06B.012. The program shall include a priority list of projects and programs, project segments and programs, transportation demand management measures, and a specific financial plan that demonstrates how the transportation improvement program can be funded. The program shall be updated at least every two years for the ensuing six-year period.

#### Regional Significance

The regional transportation system in QUADCO includes the facilities, services, and programs that exhibit one or more of the following characteristics, as required by RCW 47.80.030(1) (b) at a minimum:

- 1. Crosses member county lines.
- 2. Is, or will be, used by a significant number of people who live or work outside the county in which the facility, service, or project is located.
- 3. Significant impacts are expected in more than one county.
- 4. Potentially adverse impacts of the facility, service, program, or project can be better avoided or mitigated through adherence to regional policies.
- 5. Transportation needs addressed by a project have been identified by the regional transportation planning process and the remedy is deemed to have regional significance.
- 6. Provides for system continuity.

QUADCO's regional transportation system is multimodal and emphasizes movement of people and goods. By definition, all state highways are considered to have regional significance. Since many roads are used to haul grain and other produce to market outside the region, all roads on the Freight and Goods System are also considered to be of regional significance. Other roads that provide access to recreational facilities in the region, that attract visitors statewide, are regionally significant. All railroads, airports, transit systems and non-motorized facilities are considered to be regionally significant. Additionally, each county has identified other regionally significant transportation facilities based on local knowledge of transportation systems important within their county

#### **Project Inclusion**

The RTIP is submitted to WSDOT for approval after the QUADCO Council adoption for inclusion in the Statewide Transportation Improvement Plan (STIP). Planned projects are included in the RTIP but not moved to the STIP until funding is secured. Secure Access of Washington's WSDOT STIP service defines secure funded projects with a "S" and planned projects (without a secure funding source) with a "P". Once a member agency notifies QUADCO of funds secured for the project, QUADCO can move the project from the RTIP to the STIP. Both the RTIP and the STIP processes include a period of time for public comment. Unlike the RTIP, which is a six-year document: the STIP is a four-year plan. #### **Public Outreach**

Notice was sent out by email to all QUADCO participating agencies and stakeholders that the draft RTIP document was available to the public at QUADCO RTPO's website from April 1, 2025, to May 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2025 for comment.

#### **Policy for Amendments**

Amendments for the RTIP should be brought to the Council Meeting for approval. The approved amendments will be submitted by the agency requesting an amendment by the amendment dates set forth by WSDOT, the third Friday of every month.

#### Re: Port of Quincy Rail Infrastructure Expansion Project

<u>August 2023</u> - The "Port of Quincy Rail Infrastructure Expansion Project" would expand the rail infrastructure on the northeast side of Quincy, WA, both within the Port's current rail terminal and to nearby industrial zoned properties in the Port District. According to the most recent estimates that the Port of Quincy has received from a qualified rail engineering firm, the Project will cost about \$16 million. As a result, the Port will be requesting Federal and/or State Funding for this important freight mobility, job creating, and economic development project.



Overall, the Project would expand upon the Port's existing rail infrastructure from the Port's current rail terminal (which has been in successful operation for about the past 17 years) to the east across Road O NW to serve industrial zoned properties in northeast Quincy.

More importantly, the above proposed rail infrastructure additions are necessary to help attract and/or accommodate large job-creating industrial, manufacturing and food processing projects that want to locate on the northeast side of Quincy, as

well as to keep up with the increasing growth in ocean container freight (including frozen and dry agricultural products from central/eastern Washington) going from the Port of Quincy to the Ports of Seattle and Tacoma.

In 2017, the <a href="NW Seaport Alliance">NW Seaport Alliance</a> provided a presentation/report to shippers and stakeholders in central and eastern Washington on the "<a href="Inland Port Impact on Growing the Agriculture Industry"</a>. According to the presentation, an inland port would offer the following benefits: Congestion on major roadways and mountain passes would be reduced as the number of truck trips per day would decrease to/from the Puget Sound; containers could be moved with more speed and reliability while lowering the carbon footprint of exports via rail; containers could be spotted closer to the shippers, with 24/7 availability of picking up or dropping containers in a secured yard; would attract new investments in warehousing facilities and other industries supporting the agriculture market; and turn times could be improved so that exporters would be able to ship more product overseas because marine terminals would be less congested.

Because of the above-mentioned increased interest by industrial and manufacturing projects in the northeast side of Quincy as well as the additional cargo and containers that are being loaded and unloaded at the rail terminal there, it is especially important that the rail infrastructure be expanded.

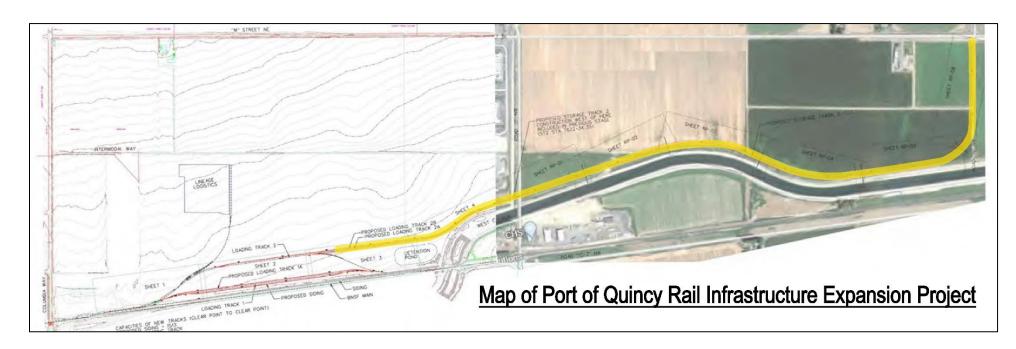
Overall, the Port of Quincy Rail Infrastructure Expansion Project has a statewide and regional benefit as it will help to, attract industrial and manufacturing projects that will create family wage jobs in central WA, provide more freight mobility options to Washington State agricultural and food shippers and exporters, lessen wear and tear on freeways, highways and mountain passes by converting over-the-road freight to rail intermodal freight, and decrease fuel consumption and carbon emissions.

In conclusion, Port of Quincy Rail Infrastructure Expansion Project would cost about \$16 million to extend rail from the existing rail terminal to the east across Road O NW to industrial zoned properties on the northeast side of Quincy, which would expand and enhance rail infrastructure to proposed industrial projects in NE Quincy as well as be able to handle the increasing volumes of westbound export container freight and eastbound domestic intermodal freight.
