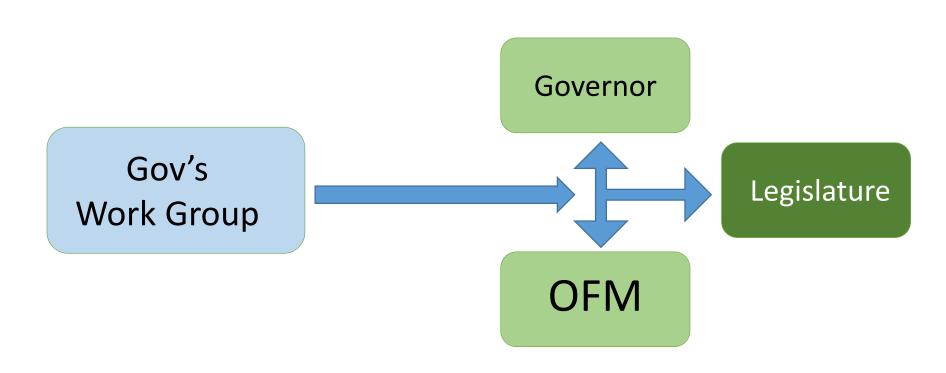

## Legislative Direction

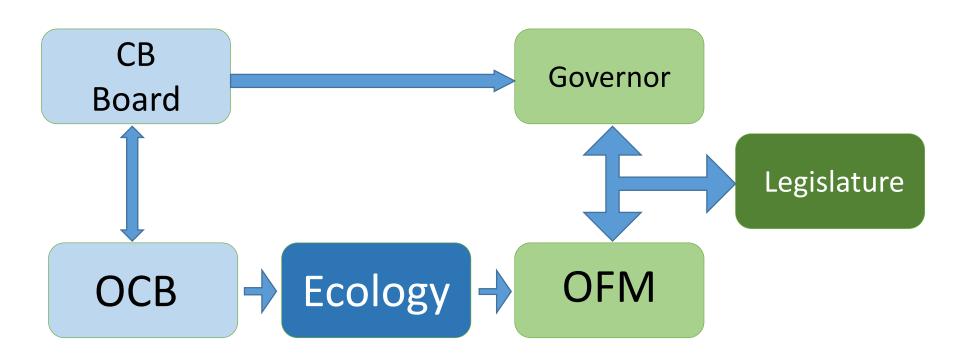
"The board is responsible for...developing biennial and supplemental budget recommendations to the governor."

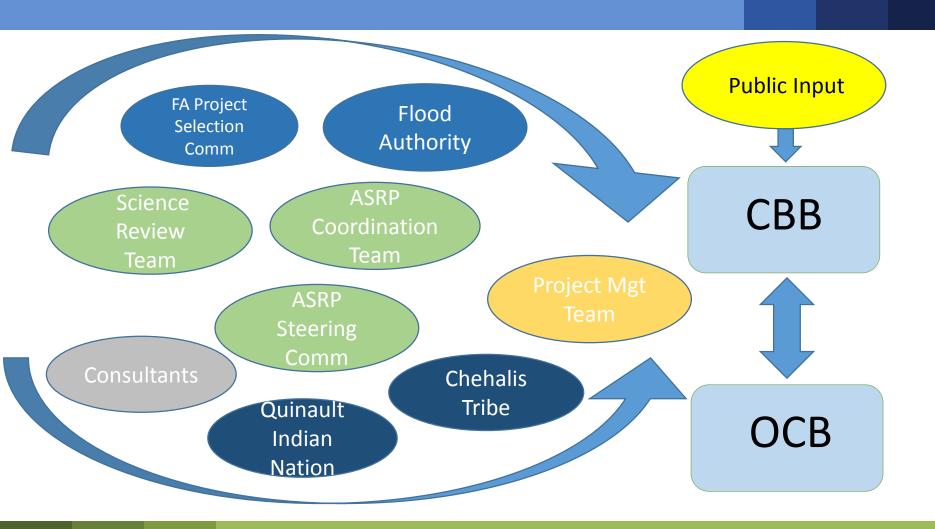
"For administrative purposes, the board is located within the department."

## **Budget Timeline**

### **MAY/JUNE**

- Preliminary Capital Budget estimates for:
  - **✓** ASRP Participation
  - ✓ On-going Studies
  - ✓ Habitat Projects
  - ✓ Local Flood Control Projects
  - ✓ Development of the Long Term Strategy
- Operating Budget decision package for:
  - **✓** OCB Core Staff

## Budget Timeline cont...

### JULY/AUGUST

- Board provides direction at July 12 CBB meeting
- Flood Authority reviews local project applications
- Estimates refined by PM Team, ASRP groups,
   Tribes, Flood Authority, Consultants, etc.
- ASRP Steering Committee approves recommendations for Board's budget request
- OCB Staff prepares draft budget recommendation for Board review

## Budget Timeline cont...

#### **SEPTEMBER**

- Sep 6: Board reviews *draft* budget recommendations
- Sep 20: Flood Authority adopts recommended prioritized list of local projects
- OCB Director briefs OFM & Legislative staff on draft budget recommendations per OFM schedule

#### **OCTOBER**

 Oct 4: Board approves final 2019-2021 Capital Budget recommendations for submittal to Governor

# 2019-2021 Budget Assumptions

- Budget process now led by OCB/Chehalis Basin Board instead of Governor's Work Group
- Continue to support a mix of "on-the-ground" actions and other activities advancing the longterm strategy
- Funding for core OCB staff shifts from Capital to Operating Budget; additional Ecology staff continue to be funded through the Capital Budget
