Nonpoint Plan Overview

- Nonpoint Plan discusses:
 - Overview of nonpoint pollution in WA
 - WA's regulatory framework
 - Strategies for addressing NP pollution
 - Ecology's nonpoint and TMDL programs
 - Best Management Practices
 - Financial incentive programs
 - Non-Ecology programs
 - Monitoring
 - Water Quality partnerships
- Plan ensures funding eligibility



Washington's Water Quality Management Plan to Control Nonpoint Sources of Pollution

Water Quality Program

Washington State Department of Ecology Olympia, Washington

December 2022, Publication 22-10-025



Voluntary Clean Water Guidance

- Scientifically-based guidance provides BMPs for agricultural producers to support compliance with state water quality laws.
- 5 Chapters submitted to EPA:
 - Livestock (pasture and rangeland BMPs), livestock (manure Storage and heavy use area BMPs), riparian areas and surface water protection, tillage and residue management and sediment basins
- Remaining 8 chapters due with 2025 Nonpoint Plan:
 - Cropping methods, vegetative sediment capture, nutrient management, pesticide management, water management (stormwater BMPs, irrigation and drainage)



Updated guidance from EPA





Updated guidance from EPA

- On May 4, 2024, EPA published an update to their "Nonpoint Source Program and Grants Guidelines for States and Territories." This guidance includes:
 - NPS program goals and national priorities
 - Components of an effective NPS management program
 - Watershed-based planning
 - Grant award mechanics
 - Funding uses, general eligibilities, requirements, and limitations
 - Reporting and tracking
 - Relationship to other federal programs



Updated guidance from EPA

Important changes for this update of the Nonpoint Plan include:

- Expanded expectations require the inclusion of:
 - Climate resilience
 - Environmental justice
 - Protection considerations
- National priorities include nutrients
- Goals and milestones table to incorporate SMART goals

Process to update the Nonpoint Plan

Updating the existing Nonpoint Plan that was submitted to EPA in 2022

- Identify topics for expanded discussion, for example
 - Work process of regional staff- compliance and technical assistance, outreach/education
 - Strategy of protection and restoration
 - Focus on temperature, climate change, riparian buffers as a holistic tool to address many pollutants
 - Environmental justice
 - Goals and milestones table
