# Session Overview

January 8 – March 7 1,835 bills introduced • 3,556 bills overall in the biennium 407 bills tracked by Ecology 15 bills traced by WR/OCR



### HB 1752

Passed Bills Modifying the application of the annual consumptive quantity calculation to change applications related to certain water rights held by the United States bureau of reclamation

### SSB 5828

Concerning water rights adjudication commissioners and referees

## HB 1752 Bureau of Reclamation ACQ Exemption

## Prime sponsor: Dye (reintroduced from 2023)

 Provides a narrow ACQ exemption for changes Bureau of Reclamation water rights within the Columbia Basin Project

### Votes:

- House 97-0
- Senate 49-0

# ESSB 5828



## Water Rights Adjudication Commissioners

### Prime sponsor: Sen. Shewmake

• Authorizes a superior court engaged in a water rights adjudication to appoint commissioners to conduct adjudication business.

#### Amendments:

- Clarification of referral appeals and challenge
- Addition of education requirements for commissioners

Votes:

- Senate 49-0
- House 95-0



# Inactive Bills

#### DEPARTMENT OF ECOLOGY State of Washington

#### HB 2074

Limiting the application of certain civil penalties to protect landowners from incurring penalties based on the actions of the landowner's lessee

#### HB 2105

Ensuring the protection of instream resources in connection with the issuance of water right permits in water resource inventory areas in which minimum instream flows are not being met

#### HB 2187

Promoting access to water for family farms

#### SSB 5517

Enacting recommendations from the joint legislative task force on water resource mitigation

#### SSB 6062

Concerning the authority of the department of natural resources to lease trust assets for the benefit of trust beneficiaries and the state

## HB 2074 Landowner/Lessee Penalties



## Prime Sponsor: Dye

• Prohibits Ecology from issuing a penalty for illegal water use to a landowner if the landowner's lessee is at fault

Progress:

• Voted 96-0 out of the House, no action taken in Senate policy committee

## HB 2105 Water Resource Mitigation



### Prime Sponsor: Rep. Fitzgibbon

- Establishes a new mitigation standard that would allow for out-of-time or outof-place mitigation measures
- Does not authorize out-of-kind mitigation
- Eliminates authorization for Ecology to approve withdrawals of water based on overriding consideration of the public interest (OCPI)

#### Progress:

• Public hearing in House, no action taken in policy committee



## HB 2187 Water for Family Farms

## Prime Sponsor: Rep. Dent

- Specifies that a family farm is in the public interest that is:
  - Located within 20 miles of a city with a population >150,000,
  - Has been in continuous operation for >100 years, and
  - Produces fruits and vegetables for urban residents
- Authorizes Ecology to approve permanent withdrawals of water under OCPI authority

#### Progress:

• Public hearing in House, no action taken in policy committee

## SSB 5517 Water Resource Mitigation



## Prime Sponsor: Sen. Warnick (reintroduced from 2023)

- Establishes a mitigation sequencing standard for new groundwater right applications in basins with regulated surface flows.
- <u>Authorizes out-of-kind mitigation</u>
- Directs Ecology to establish standards for groundwater modeling through rulemaking.
- Substitute bill adds fee-in-lieu mitigation alternative
- Progress:
  - Substitute bill voted out of Senate policy committee, no action taken in fiscal committee

## SSB 6062 DNR Trust Asset Leasing



## Prime Sponsor: Sen. Van de Wege (DNR request)

- Authorizes the Department of Natural Resources to lease trust assets (including water rights)
- Substitute bill requires Tribal notification and consultation opportunity for water right leases

### Progress:

 Voted out of Senate policy committee, no action taken in Senate ules committee

## **Operating Budget – ESSB 5950 IT Geospatial Resources**

Section 302(57)

Funding: \$206,000 for fiscal year 2025

Purpose: Initiate development of a public integrated statewide GIS application to include:

- Water right records
- Water banks and mitigation
- Metering data



## **Operating Budget – ESSB 5950 Groundwater Modeling Guidance**

Section 302(64)

Funding: \$400,000 for fiscal year 2025

Purpose: Develop a groundwater modeling guidance document, to include:

- Criteria for evaluating model suitability
- Guidelines for evaluating model error and uncertainty
- Guidelines for use of regional models



## **Operating Budget – ESSB 5950 Water Use Efficiency Program Evaluation**

Section 603(47)

Funding: \$298,000 for fiscal year 2025 (Ruckelshaus Center)

Purpose: Evaluate and recommend improvements to existing DOH water use efficency program

 $\rightarrow$  Will consider if program should be shifted to Ecology
