Notification Form Summary: Interim Policy on Lead in Cosmetics

Background

Washington State's Toxic-Free Cosmetics Act (<u>Chapter 70A.560 RCW</u>)² restricts lead in cosmetic products to less than 1 parts per million (ppm). The restriction takes effect January 1, 2025. After feedback from cosmetics manufacturers, the Washington State Department of Ecology (Ecology) has learned that a strict 1 ppm limit for lead can be difficult, or impossible, for some cosmetic products to achieve. Ecology needs more information to make a final determination about an appropriate level for allowed lead contamination.

Ecology issued an Interim Policy on Lead in Cosmetics³ to give manufacturers more time to comply with the statutory lead restriction and to give the agency more time to collect information about its feasibility. The interim policy provides manufacturers with alternative paths to compliance for products that are unable to consistently achieve lead concentrations below 1 ppm but still requires manufacturers to work to reduce lead levels in products as much as possible.

This interim policy is effective while Ecology conducts rulemaking to identify a feasible approach to regulating lead in cosmetics, including potentially adopting new limits for lead impurities in cosmetic products sold in Washington. The policy includes guidance on lead testing for those manufacturers selecting Option 2 for some or all of their cosmetic products.

On January 15, 2025, we published an <u>updated interim policy</u> to clarify that while manufacturers must notify Ecology of their decision to meet the conditions of the policy, they don't need to submit a written plan of how they'll do so. We didn't change any conditions in the policy.

Eligibility and Requirements

Manufacturers of cosmetics products sold in Washington can use the Interim Policy on Lead in Cosmetics. "Manufacturer" means any person, firm, association, partnership, corporation, governmental entity, organization, or joint venture that produces a product or is an importer or domestic distributor of a product sold or offered for sale in or into the state.

Manufacturers that choose to use the interim policy must complete the form below to notify Ecology about their use of the policy by February 1, 2025. Manufacturers that do not submit a form must comply with the statutory lead limit of less than 1 ppm.

Manufacturers that select Option 2 in the Color Cosmetics and Clay Masks section must monitor lead levels, retain lead concentration data, and submit the list of products and data to Ecology upon request for all products with lead concentrations above 5 ppm and below 10 ppm.

Manufacturers may submit an amended notification if the responses in the original notification form submitted to Ecology have changed. Amended notifications must be submitted within 10 business days of a change in the status of the compliance options being used.

Manufacturer's responses to this form will be posted publicly online so that other organizations can verify compliance with the interim policy.
