## NEPA/SEPA DEIS Impacts Avoidance, Minimization and Mitigation (AMM) Efforts

- Continue Avoidance, Minimization and Mitigation (AMM).
- USACE and Ecology will consider/incorporate commitments in the final EISs.
- Timeline:
  - Last spring, the District began developing additional AMM.
  - Additional AMM defined through the budgeting process.
  - In September, the District adopted specific commitments
  - Began to communicate these commitments to the Department of Ecology and the Army Corps of Engineers.
    - Commitments focus on a number of resources but most prominently on impacts to aquatic resources.

### Summary of Flood District Commitments

#### 1) <u>No net loss of aquatic habitat</u>

2) Mitigation of potential water temperature effects through Vegetation Management Plan in the reservoir area and downstream bank forestation

*3) Priority Use of Large Woody Debris for habitat enhancement* 

4) Use of BMP's to prevent sedimentation from road construction and use

5) Long term monitoring of unstable slopes in the reservoir area

6) No disruption of Pe Ell water supply



# Summary of District Clarifications to Project Description being analyzed in the FEISs

- Temporary Fish Passage
- Quarry Operations
- Location and configuration of access roads and Temporary Construction Facilities
- Power Supply and Levee construction to avoidd wetlands



## Ongoing Coordination with Agencies and Tribes

- Bi-weekly coordination meetings with Ecology and USACE.
- The District has conducted 8 meetings with agency staff including WDFW on technical topics.
- Upcoming meeting at the invitation of the Quinault Indian Nation scheduled for November 10.
