Topic 1 – CARB Taskforce recommendations related to conservation easements

- Ecology will share a brief overview of Taskforce recommendations related to conservation
 easements: 1) allowing conservation easements to be granted in phases over 5 years if there
 is a binding agreement requiring their enrollment and 2) requiring the easement to be in
 place prior to issuance of Ecology offset credit (or in phases no more than 5 years after
 issuance), rather than the end of the first reporting period

 - Would this change significantly impact the viability of projects that include a conservation easement?

 - What additional risks does this conservation easement flexibility introduce in the market and how could those risks be mitigated?
