I have two short comments regarding the draft PFAS CAP.

First, the state should pursue payment from responsible parties, including chemical industries, for funding for drinking water remediation and other needed environmental remediation. There is precedent for this: New Jersey has identified three PFAS manufacturers as responsible parties for PFAS contamination (https://www.nj.gov/dep/docs/statewide-pfas-directive-20190325.pdf).

Second, screening and regulatory levels for PFAS should be developed for the sum of PFAS, since multiple PFAS target similar health endpoints through similar mechanisms. There is precedent for this from the EPA and multiple states.
