

## PREASSESSMENT SCREENING OIL SPILL REPORT FORM

**Date of Incident:** June 5, 2018

**Incident Summary:** On June 5th, 2018 Ecology was notified that the 51' wood-hulled recreational vessel *Sanctuary* was on fire in Judd Cove, near Eastsound, Orcas Island. After attempts by local fire responders to extinguish the fire, the vessel eventually sank within Judd Cove. After sinking, the vessel spilled an estimated 47 gallons of diesel fuel, which spread throughout Judd Cove. Global Diving & Salvage (GDS) was hired, initially by Ecology but shortly thereafter assumed by the USCG, to respond to the spill. Island Oil Spill Association (IOSA) deployed containment boom around the sunken vessel. GDS initially removed remaining fuel from the vessel in the late evening of June 5th, 2018. Impacts were observed along the southern shoreline of the cove. The sheen was also observed during an overflight spreading outside of the cove, into Eastsound. GDS returned on June 14th, 2018, and, under the direction of Washington Department of Natural Resources (WDNR), removed the *Sanctuary* onto a crane barge. The barge then transited with the *Sanctuary* to the GDS facility in Seattle.
