## Federal Funding for ESA Species



- Species Recovery Grants and Cooperative Agreement Grants (ESA Section 6 Grants)
  - ~\$110M USFWS
  - ~\$7M NOAA (non-salmon)
- ESA funding not tied specifically to states or to number of ESA listed species
- Limited eligibility for salmon and steelhead

# Pacific Coastal Salmon Recovery Funds (PCSRF) is Primary Federal Funding Source for Salmon Recovery



- PCSRF funding initiated in 2000 by Congress
- NOAA competitive grant program
  - WA, OR, ID, AK, CA
- Annual federal appropriation
  - \$65M (total for all states)
- Anchors salmon recovery funding in Washington

#### Implementing Salmon Recovery: Washington Salmon Recovery Act (RCW 77.85)

#### Regional Recovery Organizations

- Develop recovery plans
- Implement recovery plans

#### Lead Entity Watersheds

 Lead Entities prioritize and secure local support for salmon habitat restoration and guide salmon habitat restoration

#### Salmon Recovery Funding Board

Fund and guide recovery

#### Governor's Salmon Recovery Office

 Coordinate activities – state and federal agencies, tribes, legislature, Congressional delegation, partners









#### **ESA Listed Salmon and Steelhead**



- 28 Species of Salmon and Steelhead ESA listed on West Coast
- 15 Species ESA listed in Washington
- 45% of the populations, over 75% of the area in the state



## Implications of ESA Listing for Spring Chinook on the Washington Coast Region

- First ESA listing of any Chinook species on the Washington Coast
- Requirement for NOAA-approved recovery plan
- Regulatory and permitting requirements
- No anticipated additional funds
