# Ecology, Commerce, Board updates

Ecology update – Kara Steward (presentation slides 5 through 7):

- We said thank you and goodbye to board chair Scott Morgan who has taken a position at the State Board of Community and Technical Colleges.
- Outreach and tours:
  - Center staff, interested parties, and board members attended tours of:
    - <u>Washington State Surplus<sup>3</sup></u> in Tumwater
    - <u>Arlington Recycle Warehouse<sup>4</sup> in Everett</u>
    - The 2<sup>nd</sup> Glass Summit was a success with 88 on-line attendees and five informative speakers.
    - The Center hosted a textile panel at the Washington State Recycling Association's annual conference in Vancouver, Washington. Panel members included Dr. Carly Mick,

University of Oregon, Dr. Patricia Townsend and Martha Aitken, Washington State University, and Ming-Ming Tung-Edelman, Refugee Artisan Initiative, moderated by the Center's Megan Davis.

- Center staff attended a <u>NW Sewn<sup>5</sup></u> textiles event hosted in Seattle by Prairie Underground. Discussion focused on issues and actions around textile waste. NW Sewn is an initiative of <u>Seattle Good Business Network<sup>6</sup></u>.
- The Center's budget ask moved to the next stage at Ecology. This budget request is due to the Governor's office by September. The request would provide on-going funding for the Center to invest in NextCycle Washington.
- <u>NextCycle Washington<sup>2</sup></u> circular accelerator cohort 2 pitch showcase is scheduled for September 23<sup>rd</sup> from 12:30-5:30 pm at the Seattle Central Library. In-person only, free to attend – Register online <u>2024 Pitch Showcase – NextCycle Washington<sup>8</sup></u>.

#### **Commerce update – Kirk Esmond** (presentation slides 8 and 9):

Kirk introduced new Center team member **Leslie Perkins**, who will be part of the Circular Economy Development Unit at Commerce.

- Commerce's budget includes \$2.5 million for program expansion that is funded from the Climate Commitment Act (CCA). Those funds will be available January 1, 2025 if initiative 2117 fails in November. Those funds must be spent by June 30, 2025.
- Commerce also has an ask in to get into the Governor's budget to increase their circular economy funding to \$5 million per year in on-going funds.
- Commerce attended a bio-trade and study mission to Finland.

**Board members** shared the following updates with links to online resources:

- Allen L., Circular Materials, a disposable cup recycling pilot launched in Toronto, Ontario, effective July 3<sup>rd</sup>. Pilot is the first step toward incorporating these materials in recycling systems across all Ontario by 2026. Put a call out across to help recycling flexible plastics for any and all technologies to help. <u>https://www.circularmaterials.ca/reoi/</u>
- Heather T., ZWW, conducted an in-person materials exchange forum in Spokane in June. Getting ready for legislative session and potential bills for mattress extended producer responsibility (EPR), WRAP act (EPR for packaging and paper products), organics, and refrigerant gases (also EPR).
- Jay S., NORPAC, industry is responding to tariffs with bag conversion, also responding to McKinley closure at the port, customers concerned as to where they will get their product -- leading to an increase in brown packaging at NORPAC.
- Carly M., U.O., transitioning from interim director to director of Product Design (congrats!). Doing a lot of research on how to get textile companies to collaborate with local and regional governments. Putting together a proposal for communication around post-consumer

sportswear that ends up in landfills – the how and why. Looking to use this as a template for a larger area in Oregon. Also putting together a student elective course in sustainable design.

- Preston P., Tacoma, getting all components for implementation of EPA recycling and outreach grant. Selected vendor for AI component on seven of their collection vehicles. Reviewed applications for two new positions for community ambassadors (with skills in eight different languages) that will run through the grant cycle.
- Tim S., American Chemistry Council, gathering info on agriculture plastic film and other programs, hopeful to replicate these types of activities in the PNW to capture these materials.
