for Section 401 Water Quality Certification

Dear Mr. Recchi:

Your request for a water quality certification for this project has been reviewed in conjunction with the FERC License Application Exhibit E, and the recently completed dissipating structure design and model testing evaluation. Listed below are proposed conditions which have been discussed with members of your staff:


1. The applicant shall obtain and comply with short-term exceptions to the water quality standards for pipeline crossings of streams and for work in the river at the energy dissipation structure.
2. All construction contracts for this project shall contain specification language requiring the preparation of temporary water pollution control plans by the contractor. These shall be submitted to and approved by the city project engineer prior to the contractor initiating pollution causing activities. The contracts shall also provide specific payment provisions for unanticipated water pollution control measures.
3. All construction contract documents shall contain specific reference to the State Water Quality Standards, WAC 173-201, as one of the water quality performance standards the contractor must meet.
4. The city shall obtain and comply with the Departments of Fisheries' and Game's hydraulic project approval.

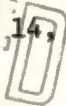
