NARRATIVE DESCRIPTION OF PROJECT:

Roza Irrigation District is seeking an emergency drought authorization for up to 978 acre-feet of water mitigated by two of New Suncadia's Water Banks, the Teanaway and Swauk-First Creek for the 2025 irrigation season. There is a total of 978 acre-feet available, however there are late season availability issues. Roza will only use water that is available and will work with the water master and New Suncadia to ensure only water available is used in the late season. Roza plans to shut off October 1 unless there is an October water allocation.

Roza will use the New Suncadia water to offset it's use throughout the irrigation season.

There will be no hit to TWSA and it is a downstream transfer.
