 - → "To provide a prioritized list of projects in WRIA 22 and 23 that will relieve flooding, compensate for impacts (if any) and that will successfully compete for funding."

- 2. We discussed the applicability of the projects being developed by the Fish Enhancement Study to the project list. Assignment: Greg will merge these projects with the project list.
- 3. Assignment: Greg will research additional sources for projects, including the Chehalis Partnership Watershed Management Plan, Lewis County Watershed Management Plan, and the local Conservation District Management Plans.
- 4. Assignment: The Project Subcommittee will go through the existing list and highlight those projects that have either been completed, or are listed 2x.
- 5. Criteria for state capital budget funding was related from Scott Boettcher and Terry Willis, who had heard the same message from Rep. Hans Dunshee and Rep. George Orcutt. These criteria include the following:
 - a. Projects are well-vetted,
 - b. Projects are "ready-to-go" (aka "shovel ready")
 - c. Projects are "jobs generators."
 - d. Projects have a match (starting at 30%, more is better).

Assignment: Greq will check the timeline for capital budget submission for the 2013-2015 biennium.
